Type of Reopening

Total reopen for all students and staff. (Some students/families may opt for distance learning out of safety/health concern.)

Considering the ever-changing landscape of COVID-19, the Health and Safety Plan must afford flexibility. Students will attend in-person instruction if possible Monday through Friday. Should student(s) be unable to attend in-person instruction, the respective student(s) will be provided with the blended online synchronous and non-synchronous option. Should the school need to clean due to COVI0-19, students will be moved to distance learning using Google Classroom with Zoom.

Western Area CTC will continually review and monitor guidance from PDE, PADOH, and CDC and has detailed in the table below the prevention and mitigation strategies that provide appropriate prevention given the current conditions. Western Area CTC will be open 5 days a week for all CTC programs. To support students who may not be able to attend all 5 days, online, Zoom classes will be provided. (Students must attend in-person at least 2 days a week.) Guidance services will be provided to all students through our Guidance Department. Employer Assistance Program services will be available to all staff in an effort to support social and emotional mental health issues.

Students will continue to follow 4-6 feet social distancing for breaks.

Classroom desks will still be spaced 4-6 feet apart.

The school nurse will instruct all students on proper handwashing and respiratory etiquette.

Handwashing and respiratory etiquette signage will continue to be posted in common areas.

Hand sanitizer and wipes will be provided in every classroom.

Staff will review and reinforce good hygiene measures such as handwashing, not touching your face, and covering coughs.

Water fountains have been replaced with bottle fillers.

High-touch surfaces will be disinfected and cleaned daily.

In the event someone becomes ill or someone has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 24 hours, those spaces they occupied will be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.

The school nurse will do all contact tracing for students and staff while in our facility.

The nurse will maintain an area to isolate students/staff that exhibit COVID-like symptoms.

State health department contact tracing and quarantine mandates will be strictly adhered to.

School administration will continue to communicate with staff and students as mandated regarding communicable diseases.
