The main responsibility associated with Class B driving jobs is picking up freight at one location and moving it to another. Drivers may also load and unload cargo, fill out paperwork, use electronic delivery tracking systems and communicate with dispatchers about changes to the schedule or route. They generally work a 40-hour week, although some CDL Class B jobs require drivers to work more than 50 hours. Schedules include early mornings or late nights, especially when driving a grocery goods truck.

### CDL CLASS B LICENSE FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS





### Q. How long is the course?

Currently, WACTC offers the Class B license program during daylight hours. You will attend Monday through Friday from roughly 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM for four (4) weeks or a total of 160 hours of instruction

### Q. How much does it cost?

WACTC is a non-profit institution, so we really try to keep our costs down. The Class B option is \$3,059.00. We have financial experts on staff to assist you in the process.

### Q. Are there job opportunities for me when I'm finished?

Class B CDL holders can work as straight truck delivery drivers. Class B delivery truck drivers typically make local deliveries allowing them to be home nightly. For those looking to stay on the road for extended periods of time, there are long-haul CDL Class B jobs available. Chartered or tour bus driving are two possibilities that keep a CDL B driver behind the wheel longer and with changing scenery. Other CDL Class B jobs may include operating straight dump trucks for landscaping and construction firms, moving sand, gravel, asphalt or mulch. Others will go on to drive small tank trucks such as airport refuelers or milk transport, or food service trucks like ice cream or construction site catering trucks.
