Q. How long is the course?

WACTC has one option for you. Our daytime program runs for one scholastic year and starts in late August this year. You will attend Monday through Friday from roughly 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM or a total of 935 hours of instruction.

Currently WACTC does not offer the Carpentry program as an evening selection..

Q. How much does it cost?

WACTC is a non-profit institution, so we really try to keep our costs down. The daytime option is \$9,526. Financial aid may be available to those who qualify. We have financial experts on staff to assist you in the process.

Q. Are there job opportunities for me when I'm finished?

Carpentry skills can be applied to residential or commercial remodeling, cabinet making and exterior and interior trim. WACTC coursework in carpentry classes includes instruction in building safety, construction codes, framing and site layout basic business skills for carpenters, cost estimating and project planning.

Each unit is taught in conjunction with related safety, estimating and blueprint reading. Completers achieve skills needed to attain employment as a Carpenter.
