Q. How long is the course?

WACTC only offers the EPS program as a daytime offering. Our daytime program runs for one scholastic year and starts in late August this year. You will attend Monday through Friday from roughly 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM or a total of 935 hours of instruction

Q. How much does it cost?

WACTC is a non-profit institution, so we really try to keep our costs down. The daytime option is \$9,126.00. Financial aid may be available to those who qualify. We have financial experts on staff to assist you in the process.

Q. Are there job opportunities for me when I'm finished?

COURSE OBJECTIVE:

Students will obtain education and skills in the areas of firefighting, police work and emergency medical technician. Students also receive additional training for possible emergency & security measures with the gas and oil industry

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This 935 hour (one year) program provides classroom and practical experience for entrance into the field of public safety via in-depth training to perform duties as a Police Officer, Firefighter, Emergency Medical Technician and other public safety-related careers. Students receive training in social and psychological skills, vehicle and equipment operations, the judicial system, pre-hospital emergency medical crew, fire prevention and control, hazardous materials and emergency management.
