CARES Act HEERF Student Share Grant Policy for the Award and Administration of Funds

On Friday, March 27, 2020, the federal government enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act"). Section 18004 of the CARES Act establishes the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund ("HEERF"). The HEERF provides emergency funding to institutions of higher education, including funds that must go directly to students in the form of emergency financial aid grants (the "HEERF Student Share Grant Funds") for "expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus (including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance, such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child-care)" (the "HEERF Eligible Expenses").

On March 13, 2020, Western Area Career & Technology Center campus buildings were closed to all except essential personnel.

II. Purpose and Scope

Western Area Career & Technology Center is eligible to receive up to \$61,886.00 in HEERF Student Share Grant Funds. Under Section 18004(c) of the CARES Act, these funds must be used for HEERF Eligible Expenses.

III. Policy

The CARES Act requires that institutions disburse the HEERF Student Share Grant Funds to eligible students for HEERF Eligible Expenses. Students enrolled in Title IV programs may apply for the HEERF Student Share Grant Funds. This policy presents the schools methodology for determining eligibility under the CARES Act, as well as the process and procedure for distributing and disbursing the HEERF Student Share Grant Funds. HEERF Student Share Grant Funds cannot be applied by Western Area Career & Technology Center toward a student's account balance.

A. Eligibility

Under the CARES Act and subsequent administrative interpretation provided by the Department of Education ("ED"), students eligible to receive HEERF Student Share Grant Funds ("Eligible Students") must meet all eligibility criteria listed below:

i. Students must have completed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid ("FASFA") for the 2019-2020 Academic Year and be deemed eligible for Title IV aid.

According to Section 9 of the Department of Education FAQ guidance issued on April 21, 2020, only students who are or could be eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended ("HEA"), may receive HEERF Student Share Grant Funds.

Western Area Career & Technology Center has determined the practical way to determine that a student is eligible to participate in the Title IV programs and meets all applicable student eligibility requirements is if the student has a completed FAFSA, has received an official Student Aid Report ("SAR"), has a valid Expected Family Contribution ("EFC") on file for the 2019-2020 Academic Year, and meets all other Section 484 eligibility criteria.

Western Area Career & Technology Center students who had not previously submitted a FAFSA were notified via telephone and advised to submit a FAFSA no later than Monday, June 24, 2020, by going to **studentaid.gov**. Students who submit a 2019-2020 FAFSA after June 24, 2020, may be eligible, pending available funds.

ii. Students must have been enrolled in a Title IV eligible certificate program at the time of the Disruption of Program Operations.

Students who have an effective withdrawal date prior to March 13, 2020 cannot receive HEERF Student Share Grant Funds. March 13, 2020 is the date which on-campus instruction was suspended, disrupting the Programs normal operations, as described above, and giving rise to HEERF Eligible Expenses.

iii. Students must have been enrolled for the Spring 2020 academic term.

iv. Students must submit a Western Area Career & Technology Center HEERF Student Application for Emergency Aid.

B. HEERF Eligible Expenses

Eligible Students who have incurred HEERF Eligible Expenses are eligible to receive HEERF Student Share Grant Funds.

HEERF Eligible Expenses must have been incurred no earlier than March 13, 2020.
