

NCLEX Knowledge Question Answers:

1. **D.** The nurse should recognize that anorexia is a possible indication of digoxin toxicity. Therefore, the nurse should assess this client first.

- 2. **C.** Manifestations of postpartum hemorrhage include saturation of the perineal pad, as well as dizziness and weakness. When providing client care, the nurse should first use the least-invasive intervention; therefore, the first action the nurse should take is to massage the client's fundus.
- 3. **C**, D & E. If the client is alert and healthy, begin auscultation with the client sitting upright and leaning slightly forward. Ask the client to breathe through an open moth slightly deeper that usual. Progress downward from lung apices to the bases. Auscultate over all areas of the anterior and posterior thorax, moving side to side and working inferiorly to the lung bases. Listen over each field for one complete respiratory cycle
